Breaking Down Walls - Priceless!

Jamie and Max recently travelled to San Angelo, Texas to see her 93 year-old grandfather, Papa (pronounced Paw Paw). This was the first time for him and Max to meet. Those of you who know our three-year-old son know how energetic and exciting this visit was. For obvious reasons, it was important that Jamie and Max go see Papa, and the trip did not disappoint. Max was 100% Max, and Papa loved every minute of it.

Do you remember the old MasterCard "Priceless" commercials? They would total up the expenses for a certain trip or event, maybe it was travel to see your favorite team play in a championship game or putting forth the funds and energy to take that dream vacation. In the case of Jamie and Max's trip to Texas, I can hear the MasterCard narration:

Two tickets to San Angelo – More than anyone wants to pay; Energy required to wrangle a three-year-old on a airplane – Endless; Nerves once you finally arrive at your destination – Frayed; Watching your grandfather meet his great-grandson for the first time – Priceless.

Walls were broken down on that trip. It is not that Jamie or her grandfather put up walls between he and Max; it was just that they had never met. They didn't know each other. They now have seen the other, hugged the other, laughed with each other. Priceless.

During our Wednesday evening Taizé services in Lent, we have spent time passing out pictures or names of church members and asked you to pray for those individuals or families during the next week. We have done this in hopes of breaking down walls in our community at Greystone.

We don't intentionally construct these walls anymore than the now broken down wall between Papa and Max. These walls just happen because we don't know each other. Prayer helps break down these walls. Through prayer, faces become people and names become family.

If you haven't made it to one of our Wednesday Taizé services, I hope you will come. If you can't then flip through your pictorial directory, pick an individual or family, and pray for them for a week. You might be surprised how walls that were once difficult to see begin to crumble, and how you grow in your realization of how priceless the Greystone family of faith is to you.

Christmas in March

On Christmas Eve our church took up an offering to help with flood relief in South Carolina. The Missions Team has been working with Baptists in Kingstree, SC to understand how our church can help.

This area was ravaged by rising waters and is one of the poorest counties in SC. We are now ready to put you and the monies we collected to work.

Church members will be leaving early on Friday, March 11 and work until late Sunday afternoon, March 13. We are looking for 8 to 10 men to volunteer. The options for lodging are tight, and unfortunately the church we are working with has only one room for us to use for sleeping making this a men's trip. It is a nice, heated room so bring your cot or air mattress.

Working with South Carolina CBF we will replace a plywood floor, put insulation in the walls, hang sheet rock and replace paneling on some walls in a local family's home. Little experience is required.
