Leading Bible Study with Preschoolers and Children - Emily Carter Cox, a child and family therapist with the UNC Department of Psychiatry, Raleigh Campus, will join us in January to talk about child development and children's understanding at different ages. She will discuss specifically how to share some of our most beloved yet problematic Bible stories when working and learning with children.

Winter Bible Study: The Megillot - Join us for a Bible study based on the "little books" of the Old Testament - Ruth, Esther, Song of Songs, Lamentations, and Ecclesiastes. Dr. Tony Cartledge will lead our study. Tony has taught Old Testament, writing, and ministry courses at Campbell University Divinity School since 2007. He has published hundreds of articles and several books as sole author (Vows in the Old Testament and the Ancient Near East; 1 & 2 Samuel; Intrigued, How I Love to Proclaim It; Tall Tales and Deep Truths; Sessions with Genesis; and Sessions with Samuel). He is co-author of A Whole New World: Life after Bethany and Job: Into the Fire, Out of the Ashes, and I'm in Cells: The Captivating Story of Bob Barker and the Bob Barker Company. In addition to his teaching responsibilities at Campbell, Cartledge writes a weekly Sunday School curriculum called Nurturing Faith and is Contributing Editor for the national news journal Baptists Today. You will not want to miss this study.

Together for Hope of Arkansas began in 2003

the new year will begin for our currently

as part of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship's Rural Poverty Initiative. The focus of the ministry has evolved over the years. Literacy and vouth leadership development are now the primary focus. Although, work goes on all year using local and regional volunteers, each summer volunteers from several states converge on Helena-West Helena as part of the All Church Challenge (ACC). These two weeks include Swim Camp for kids ages 6-12, Preschool Camp, Stories on Wheels Camp, Construction Projects, and Blessings Ministry. The Swim Camp includes Bible study, music, crafts, a sport, and two swim lessons per day. Preschool Camp offers similar activities. The Stories on Wheels Bus goes to Lakeview, a small isolated town, and has a camp with Bible study, games, and a literacy activity for kids of all ages. A leadership camp for teens is held the first week of ACC and these teens volunteer during the second week. Volunteer opportunities include teaching a sport or swimming, leading crafts, games, or music or being a group leader who shepherds a group of kids through activities. Construction projects are different every year. They have included everything from building a church to building a ramp to roofing a house. Last year work was begun on Freeman Playground, a playground for children of all abilities. Blessings Ministry is the name for a group of volunteers who do random acts of kindness for people in the community. This might include visiting elderly people in their homes or in nursing homes, baking cookies to give away, or making lunches for the kids in camp. Activities can be whatever the group wants to do that will bless others. Greystone has been sending a team to Arkansas every year since 2005. Forty-five members of the Grevstone family have made the trip at least once. Some have been many times. This trip is open to families, college students, and individuals. Greystone plans to participate the second week of ACC, July 15-21. The team plans to drive this year which will bring down the cost. People who do not wish to drive could make their own flight arrangements. We stay in a local church and sleep in sleeping bags.
