Winter Bible Study

Question: What kind of man was Boaz before he got married?

Answer: Ruthless

My apologies for the bad pun. (Really you should blame Jeb Brookshire. He sent me that joke a couple of weeks ago.) As many of you know, Ruth and Boaz's story is the whole of the book of Ruth, one of the five "little scrolls" known as the Megillot.

For our Winter Bible Study, Dr. Tony Cartledge will be walking through the five books of the Megillot: The Song of Songs (or The Song of Solomon), Ruth, Lamentations, Ecclesiastes, and Esther. These books of the Hebrew Bible and Christian Old Testament are often read less by Protestants yet are still a wonderfully rich resource for growing in our understanding of God's presence.

In our worship on January 29th, Dr. Cartledge took us through a portion of Lamentations with his proclaiming, opening our eyes to how the "man of constant sorrows" could still have hope in the midst of trials and tribulation. The hope felt by the author of Lamentations comes not from the promise of a life free of difficulty relative to one's faithfulness. Rather hope comes from the promise of God's presence through all of the trials of life; both those that are connected to our own decisions and those that just happen to us.

The other four books of the Megillot are similarly filled with radiant pictures of the wonder and sustaining presence of God in our lives and in the world. Every Wednesday night in February, Dr. Cartledge will be our docent walking us through the stories of the remaining four little scrolls.

In addition to teaching Old Testament, writing and ministry classes at Campbell University Divinity School, Dr. Cartledge writes a weekly Sunday School curriculum called *Nurturing Faith* and is a Contributing Editor for the national news journal *Baptists Today*.
