WYATT WORKS

Marc and Kim Wyatt, CBF Advocates for Internationals, continue their ambitious programs in the Triangle. Since October, 67 refugees have been received at Welcome House in Raleigh. Welcome House provides temporary housing in a group setting. This allows time for these newcomers to find permanent housing, and the multifamily design helps guests to acclimate to their new setting.

With the Wyatt's encouragement, Hope Valley Baptist Church in Durham is establishing Hope House Refugee Resettlement on their campus, able to house 8 persons at a time. Greystone and other churches are partnering with HVBC by donations and direct volunteer support. The last of GBC Mission Team Pay It Forward funds were presented to HVBC, who have expressed their humble gratitude.

Ways for us at GBC to continue support for this ministry of hospitality are to help supply small things to set up apartments. Alarm clocks, can openers, cleaning supplies and shower curtain liners are needed. We are also seeking someone to join the hospitality team for Welcome House. This position may include making a meal for newly arrived, cleaning vacated rooms at Welcome House, or helping a newly arrived family move into their transitional home.
