## Children's Ministry

During the week of July 3 - 6, our 3rd - 5th graders enjoyed some time in Montreat, North Carolina. Surrounded by scenic mountains and a beautiful lake we encountered God together as we participated in *PASSPORTkids* Camp. Our theme for the week was "DO, LOVE, WALK" based on Micah 6:8 which says "What does the Lord require of you but to do justice, to love kindness and to walk humbly with God."

The theme was brought to life through interactive Bible studies and worship. Throughout the week, students learned the stories of the rich young ruler, the Good Samaritan, and Namaan. Campers acted out these stories, and read modern day versions of them to help them integrate when they learned into their everyday lives.

David, our pastor for the week, told great stories that the campers really learned from. One of the campers' favorite stories can be found in a book titled *Four Feet, Two Sandals* which is about two young refugee girls who loved kindness by sharing a single pair of shoes. Many of our campers help lead in worship through reading litanies, dancing and participating in an art project.

Our offering for the week went to *Watering Malawi*. This ministry provides clean water, hand washing stations, education and more to the people in the small country of Malawi. On the second night of camp, campers participated in a night market which really helped them understand why this ministry is so vitally important.
