The work continues. So here is my chance to pull out my pompoms and cheer – Go Greystone! The ministry that you are offering right now is important and will, by the grace of God, propel us into the future. Go Greystone! Go!

A PRAYER OF INDIFFERENCE

Over 70 people gathered in the Fellowship Hall on Monday night, July 17. We met with Dr. Bill Wilson from the Center for Healthy Churches. Dr. Wilson shared his insight and expertise on how congregations can use the time in between pastors to clarify their vision and build for the future health and longevity of the church. Dr. Wilson encouraged us to pray with indifference, to pray as Jesus did, "not my will but Yours be done."

Finding a pastor and creating a shared vision is a spiritual task not simply a cognitive exercise. We will never be smart enough to do this without God. To pray for indifference does not mean we are apathetic. It means that we are so focused on God that we are indifferent to ourselves. We become indifferent to our wants and desires. We become ready to serve and are laser focused onto living God's desires for our congregation.

So, let's begin this work and pray every day: God's Will. Nothing more. Nothing else. Nothing less.

NEW HANDICAP SPACES IN SAWMILL LOT AND GUIDELINES

Due to the need for additional spaces for handicap parking in the Sawmill parking lot, four new spaces have been designated with appropriate signage near the sanctuary entrance. This includes three standard handicap spaces and one handicap space with van access.

During the month of August, the Sawmill lot will be re-sealed, and the parking spaces will be re-painted, which will help with identification of these newly-available spaces. Please do NOT park in any hashed access areas adjacent to the handicap parking spaces. These are marked per ADA guidelines and are to be left clear for persons who must use wheelchairs and walkers to get in or out of their vehicles. Hopefully, the additional handicap spaces will provide some relief for those who need them. I will continue to monitor this need and make more spaces available as necessary.
