BARRY'S NOTES...

TIPS FOR WELCOMING A NEW PASTOR

In a few weeks or months, we will experience the joy of welcoming a new pastor. When a congregation welcomes a new pastor, it marks the beginning of a new chapter for both the congregation and the minister.

To maximize this new beginning, it is important to prepare spiritually, cognitively and emotionally for this new chapter. Here are few things to remember as we prepare to welcome and encourage our new pastor:

- 1. Pray for our new pastor. Make a commitment to pray daily for our pastor throughout the duration of his or her ministry. Once the "honeymoon period" is over and the daily grind of ministry begins, praying for your pastor will strengthen your pastor's ministry and will fortify your bond with your pastor.
- **2. Send our pastor a welcome note or email.** Nothing lengthy. Just a brief note, introducing yourself and/or family, and offering a heartfelt welcome.
- 3. Mention your name on your first several encounters with our new pastor. Learning names is important for pastors. Give our pastor the opportunity to learn your name and, over time, to learn a part of your life story.
- 4. Embrace the uniqueness of our pastor. Our pastor will have a distinct personality, a unique set of spiritual gifts, and a diverse set of experiences. To compare our new pastor to any other is to disrespect the Spirit's role in guiding us to our new pastor in the first place.
- **5. Be prepared to follow.** A pastor who is worth his or her salt must lead in both optimal and challenging situations. And the kingdom of God is enriched when we as a congregation follow our pastor and embrace our mission with enthusiasm. Don't be a backseat driver. Let us serve with our best gifts.
- **6. Give our pastor permission to fail.** The best pastors don't succeed 100 percent of the time. Don't hold our pastor to a

standard of perfection that is impossible to maintain. Allow our minister room to make a few mistakes.

7. Speak positively about our pastor publicly and privately. Every pastor has more strengths than weaknesses. A healthy pastoral tenure is nurtured when we magnify around our pastor's strengths, and then minimize and compensate for our pastor's weaknesses.

God is preparing us to "build up" the body of Christ at Greystone and to reach deeper into the community that surrounds us. And the way we call and welcome our new pastor is one important step on that journey.

I am honored to serve alongside you during this brief but important transitional season.
