# Children's Ministry

### SUNDAY DEC. 23 - CHILDREN'S NATIVITY

We will present our Children's Nativity on Christmas Eve as part of our morning worship service. Elementary students will gather at 9:15 in the Fellowship Hall to prepare for our part in worship. Preschoolers will meet in their regular classrooms and join us for the rehearsal in the sanctuary. Children are encouraged to wear a costume to be a part of the Nativity. Costumes can be simple - white clothing for angels, neutral colors and a bathrobe for shepherds and wisemen. Our preschoolers sometimes enjoy dressing up as the animals in the stable. They can wear the color of their favorite stable animal. We have some costume pieces here to add to what you have. We will spend some time on costumes during the Sunday School hour as well. Children

will present the Nativity during the early part of the service. After we lead in worship, students will return to sit with their parents and preschoolers can move to worship care if they desire, though they are welcome to stay and enjoy the service.

### CHRISTMAS EVE WORSHIP AT 5:30 PM

Join us for this family friendly worship service with candlelight communion. As a part of worship, we will share communion and offer a blessing for children who do not yet take communion. We have battery powered candles for children during the candlelight portion of the service. During the children's message all children present will be invited to join Mike and sing Away in the Manger. This service is designed for families to worship together so there is no childcare provided during the service. We will have quiet toys in the back corner of the sanctuary for our youngest worshippers.


# CHRISTMAS AT GREYSTONE: AND ON EARTH, PEACE, SUNDAY, DEC. 9 AT 6:30 PM

# YOUTH FALL RETREAT FILLED WITH ENJOYMENT

"So I recommend having fun, because there is nothing better for people in this world than to eat, drink, and enjoy life. That way they will experience some happiness along with all the hard work God gives them under the sun." -Ecclesiastes 8:15 (NLT)

These words served as a theme verse for the Youth Fall Retreat, held at Camp Cale on the Albemarle Sound during the weekend of November 9 - 11. The retreat centered on the idea of "Enjoy Life" as the students reflected on how life is a gift from God and is supposed to be something that is enjoyed, not something that causes stress and tension.

Students discussed how envy, particularly envy related to social media and technology, can draw them away from friendships and into more isolated lifestyles. They also discussed the hard work that God gives them under the sun — the many stresses that tug at them in their daily lives. All of these things can take way from a life which should be enjoyed, but they are blessed with many friendships to encourage them.

In addition, the students had the opportunity to live out the theme of the weekend by playing archery tag, knockerball, and climbing a rock wall as well as several other games featured by Camp Cale. What an opportunity to put away the textbooks and the smart phones and laugh with friends while watching a beautiful sunset.

Thank you as well to the adults who attended the retreat as adult leaders. It is a lot easier to enjoy life when adults are enjoying it alongside the students!
