EASTER IS COMING... BUT IT'S NOT HERE YET!

I have three hydrangeas at my house, one in a pot and two in the ground. Hydrangeas have been my favorite plant for some time now. I first fell in love with them when I realized their purply blue would change color if you put coffee grinds in the dirt around their roots. I had to buy some to plant in my own yard and observe. Over the years I have watched these same plants sprout and flower and then whither away when the temperatures turned colder. If I didn't know better, I'd be tempted to cut them down in the fall, assuming they were as dead as they looked.

It's almost theological, the way the green leaves emerge from otherwise brittle and lifeless stems. And always right on time.

Here we are in the middle of Lent, eager to celebrate resurrection and proclaim the promise that Christ will have the final word over death. But it isn't quite time for that yet, just like it isn't quite time for the leaves and flowers of the beautiful hydrangeas to re-emerge from their dormant branches. But as they peek out I am reminded of the promise – which is worth waiting for – that new life is just around the corner.

We join with Christians around the world who continue to wait for Easter. The Lenten journey is nearing its end. Holy Week is in sight. And yet it is not quite time to sing our Alleluias. So we wait. In this season of holy waiting, how might you be intentional about ending your spiritual journey through the wilderness? Perhaps you can use this time to reflect on some of the lessons that the season and the journey has held for you? What did this wilderness journey teach you? How will you carry those lessons into your season of Easter? If you're not sure yet, don't worry! You still have 3 weeks or so to listen for God's Spirit to guide you.

Peace for the ending of this journey; and consider the hydrangeas, a promise that no matter how long the wilderness drags on, Easter is coming!

That means that even in 1983/84, Greystone was open to being led by whoever God called to lead, regardless of gender!
