MS STUDENTS FILLED WITH COMPASSION

The theme of the Middle School Overnight on Friday, May 17 - Saturday, May 18 was "Be Compassionate". The overnight included recreation, Bible study, and service projects that asked students step out of their comfort zones and interact with people who may not always feel the love of God.

After Saturday morning Bible study reflecting on Jesus' love for some of the lonely people of his day, the students made several new friends while leading a round of Bingo games at Springmoor Supportive Living. Later that afternoon, the students volunteered with Oak City Cares, a multi-purpose facility downtown. One purpose is the serving of meals, which happens often at Oak City Cares, packaged and provided 133,272 meals. We have quite literally put food on the table in places like Haiti, Madagascar, and Nicaragua. Because of these efforts we as a community of faith know in our hearts, head and bodies that "Rice goes last" and that ending global hunger is a matter of will. We put on the hair nets and committed ourselves to end hunger by 2030.

We shared. Buddy Break means a lot to Greystone. We provided training money to two other churches in North Carolina so they could start their own respite care programs for families with children who have all types of special needs. This ministry has been a blessing to our community of faith, and we are delighted to grow the work and reach more families. **We started a church**. Over the past 2
