



Again this summer, 6th - 12th grade students are invited to join students from several churches for Unidiversity Youth Camp. This year's camp will be at Maryville College in Knoxville, Tennessee. We will spend a week of Bible study, fellowship, recreation, and worship exploring the theme Fathoms based on Psalm 139.

In this fast-paced world, it is easy to focus on quick fixes and instant gratification. Even the popularity of social media encourages communication with just a few characters or a "like". However, following God asks us to seek a deeper understanding of our faith and the world. Join us for a chance to reflect on how we can fathom knowledge, presence, creation, and call to grow closer together and closer to God.

We will depart from the church early in the morning of Monday, July 22 and arrive back to the church late in the afternoon of Saturday, July 27. The cost for this year's camp is \$375 but an early bird discount is available if all forms and money are turned in by June 5, making the cost \$325.

SMAC is an opportunity for children to explore the rich world of music and the arts—including singing, movement, instruments, drama, crafts, and more—in a fun, energetic environment. The highlight of the week is always the Camp Musical. They will learn an entire musical in one week—drama, staging, singing, and all!
