INTRODUCING REV. DR. CHRISHAIRE The Interim Minister of Music Search Committee is excited to introduce Chris Haire as our Interim Minister of Music. Chris comes to us after completing a 14-month Interim at Westwood Baptist in Cary, NC. He is a native of Garner, NC

and has spent the majority of his life in the Triangle Area. With degrees from UNC-Chapel Hill, Southeastern Baptist Theological Seminary and UNC-Greensboro, Chris brings a wealth of knowledge and experience in choral music and music education. He's also got a business background, which should also come in handy. His musical interests range from handbells to motivating others to enjoy the choral experience. He is an educator at heart, a people-person, and an absolute joy to be around. During our conversations with Chris this past month, the search committee has been encouraged by his experiences with pastoral care, his deep faith, and his vision for music as ministry within the church and beyond her walls (think: a missional choir!). He has a reputation in our area for musical excellence and cultivating deep and long-lasting relationships with choir

members. In fact, every church he's served as Music Minister has experienced growth, even during interim periods.

During his time at Greystone, which begins August 1, Chris will work 30-hours per week. His primary responsibilities will include Sundays and Wednesday nights, leading 3 ensembles (adult choir, adult handbells, student choir), attending weekly staff meetings, planning and coordinating all worship services, overseeing and being a resource for all ministries related to music and the arts (including children's choirs), and serving as the staff liaison to the Worship Committee, Music Team, and Ordinance Team.

BACK TO SCHOOL SUPPLIES FOR CEDAR POINT

As we look to the upcoming school year, the Missions Committee is partnering with Hope Refugee Partners and their work to support over 150 students at Cedar Point. Items may be dropped off at the collection bins outside the Sanctuary. Please bring your items by August 11.

Hope Refugee Partners is planning to use the items to stock their "Back to School Sale". At this sale, parents can purchase backpacks and school supplies required for the school year for all students in their family. The price charged is minimal (generally just a few dollars per student for all of their supplies). It is important to include parents in the process of getting ready for school and not foster dependency. This is why they are hosting a sale and not a giveaway. By selling the school supplies, parents feel empowered to provide for their children and the children get the joy of having their parents provide for them. All of the proceeds are invested right back into year-round tutoring and homework help ministries.

DISASTER PREPAREDNESS

Greystone will be hosting a "Disaster Preparedness & Response Mission Collective" on Saturday, August 24. Churches from all over NC will come together to discuss better ways to minister and respond during natural disasters. As you know we have a team that has been working in Lumberton, NC for over 2 years now. This is a critical need in our state. The meeting is from 9-2 and the cost is \$5 (includes lunch). UNIDIVERSITY YOUTH CAMP - AN UNFATHOMABLE EXPERIENCE

Unidiversity Youth Camp 2019 was another incredible week for the 30 students and adults from Greystone Baptist Church as well as the over 400 students and adults from many churches across the Southeast. This year's camp was held at Maryville College in Tennessee, from July 22 - 27, and the theme was *Fathoms*. Students were invited to explore the depths of their relationship with God in incredible ways.

For the second day, students fathomed God's presence as they considered that God's presence is everywhere, and there is no hiding from God. UPCOMING ENDOWMENTS MOTION

During the January Church Conference, the church passed a motion authorizing the Mission Committee to develop a motion for the creation of a Mission Endowment. The Mission Committee was granted six months to study and develop this motion.

During the course of this six months much input has been received from all sectors of the Greystone Church family. During this discourse, it became apparent that we should consider a Mission Endowment and also a Properties Endowment. The Mission Committee has been working with the Properties Committee to develop a Properties Endowment along with the development of a Mission Endowment. They will be two distinctly different endowments, but the underlying language in both are very similar.

Please know that over the next month there will be a concerted effort to share the proposed endowment motion for any further feedback and refinement to a number of groups within the church: Staff, Diaconate, Leadership Council, Mission Committee, Properties Committee. Based on this understanding, please know we plan to present a single motion at our September 4 Church Conference that will serve to establish both a Missions Endowment and a Properties Endowment.

Prior to the September 4 Church Conference, copies of both endowments will be made available to all members for their review before voting on the motion to approve.
