As the warm humid air finally turns crisp, as the greens of the foliage turn to magnificent shades of orange, red, and yellow, we are reminded that the seasons are once again changing. This move, from summer to fall is welcome by many as it provides relief from the sweltering heat of the Carolina summer. For others, it marks an end to sunshine, longer days, and the relaxed pace in exchange for dark nights forced inside to keep warm. The church, too, shifts her rhythms in this season as we prepare for Commitment Sunday, Thanksgiving,



and ultimately, the season of Advent. There are budgets to prepare and vote on (Church Conference on November 17 at 6PM). There are financial commitments to pledge to the church for the upcoming year. There are holiday gatherings and additional events on the calendar, all marking this extraordinary season in the life of this church.

On October 20, at a called Church Conference, we affirmed the expansion of April Alston's roles to include Student Ministry. This is a temporary expansion of her responsibilities which will enable the Personnel Committee, the diaconate, and (eventually) a search team (not yet formed) to focus on calling our next minister with students. We are so grateful that April was willing to accept this new role and we are confident that the student ministry will thrive under her leadership. April has years of experience serving in a similar role (Children & Youth) in other churches, and is eager to share her gifts with Greystone in this new way. Please continue to pray for April and our church as we begin to discern a staffing model that will carry us into our future together.

The first half of November marks the season of Stewardship. This year's theme is Growing Greystone: Seasons of Giving. You may remember this from Lou Ostendorff's "Stewardship Rap". If you don't know what I'm talking about, you really missed out! You'll have to ask him for a copy (or live performance)! It's a reminder that God is with us in all seasons of life and that the church needs our support in ever season as well, so that we can continue to be the body of Christ in our world. We've heard testimonies from church members who wanted to share their answers to the question "Why do I give?" and each one has inspired us to consider why we give to support the ministry of Greystone Baptist Church. I wonder what your response might be?

The Stewardship Committee has been working hard to inspire record-breaking pledging this year. We've traditionally held between 45 and 65% of the budget pledged. This year, we'd like to get closer to 100%. Every pledge counts as we reach toward this goal.

# New Support Group at Greystone for Parents of Addicted Loved Ones

#### Non-profit helps give family members hope

As attention is drawn toward the horrific battle our country is fighting against addiction, there's a group of victims in the shadows who are unwillingly on the front lines.



The parents and family members of addicts are collateral damage – their lives are turned upside down by financial and emotional hardship as they struggle to help their addicted loved one, marriages are destroyed and many times, they lose hope.

There's an organization here at Greystone that is coming alongside families to bring healing and hope.

Parents of Addicted Loved Ones (PAL) helps families deal with the issues surrounding an adult child struggling with addiction by providing free education, fellowship, and most important, hope. PAL addresses both the "head" and the "heart" issues surrounding a loved one with addiction. Each meeting provides:

- An evidenced-based curriculum of addiction education dealing with critical issues ranging from healthy helping vs. enabling to delayed emotional growth, created by professionals in the treatment and recovery industry, helping parents to set healthy boundaries.
- Peer-to-peer support with other parents on the same journey, where they can share what has and hasn't worked for them, and where they can openly share their stories without fear of judgement.


Why is it so successful? Because it works. Parents discover the **tools they need** to handle their child's addiction in healthy ways, and they gain **the support they want** from other parents experiencing the same challenges.

The free weekly groups are led by trained volunteer facilitators who have experienced the issues first-hand, and are open to not just parents, but spouses, grandparents, siblings and close friends, as long as they are 18 and older and not actively ADDICTED THEMSELVES.

As I think about why I give, I remember the 4 themes of Advent. Hope, Peace, Joy, Love, and the Incarnate Christ. I give because I believe our world is in desperate need of all of these things, and I also believe the Church, which is Christ's body in the world, is the best way to spread them in it. I give so that hope, peace, joy, and love have a chance... and so that others will experience Emmanuel, God with us.

With the onset of these special days, I am increasingly aware of the refrain from Psalm 118, "Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good. His love endures forever," (v.1). Considering these words from the Psalm, and as I prepare for this season, I am making a spiritual commitment to gratitude. Beginning this month, I will keep a gratitude journal, just a simple list of gifts from God that I recognize each day. As I write, I plan to give God thanks for those gifts. I anticipate the usual suspects of family, church, home, friends, food, etc., will appear, but I also wonder what surprises will emerge along the way. As a supplement to my own thinking and journaling, I'll be reading Diana Butler Bass's book, *Grateful*. I wonder if any of you might want to join in this little gratitude experiment with me? Let me know if you do! Please know that each and every day, I give thanks for you, Greystone Baptist Church.
