Prayer of Remembrance

- One: Oh God, our God, why have you forsaken us? Why are you so far from helping us, so far from the words of our groaning?
- All: We cry by day to you, but you do not answer, and by night, but we find no rest.
- One: In you, our ancestors trusted. They trusted and you delivered them.
- All: It was you who brought each of us from the womb, you who breathed life into our flesh and bone, you who kept us safe, all the days of our lives, you have been our God.
- One: Do not be far from us now, Oh God, for grief and pain are near, and there seems to be no one to help.
- All: The words of scripture remind us: God does not hide from us. When we cry to God, God hears our cries.
- One: Though the pandemic has not come to an end, we give thanks for the moment we are in. We give thanks for vaccines, for treatments, for medicines, and knowledge that helps us move forward.
